PART 1 (2 minutes)

I: City & Guilds International Spoken ESOL Test, Achiever level, (give today's date).

(NB This introduction only needs to be recorded before the first candidate's test begins, not for subsequent candidates.)

(Give candidate's name.) Test begins. Hello. My name's (give full name). Can you spell your family name for me, please?

- C: (Spells family name.)
- I: Thank you. Where are you from?
- C: (Responds.)
- I: Thank you. Now, in the first part of the test I'm going to ask you some questions about yourself. All right? (Choose up to five questions, one from each of the different topic areas, as time allows. Name the topic; eg 'Now, Travel'.)

Topics

House, Home and environment

- Do you prefer living in the city or the countryside?
- Can you tell me a few things about the area where you live?
- What kind of house do you like?
- What pet would you like to have?

Free time and entertainment

- Do you have any special interests or hobbies?
- How often do you go out with friends?
- How do you usually entertain yourself in your free time?
- Where do you usually go on holiday?

Travel

- Which country would you like to visit in the future?
- Can you tell me a few things about your favourite holiday destination?
- Would you ever go on a hiking holiday?
- What is your favourite means of transport? Why?

(continued)

Daily life

- Do you like studying alone or with classmates?
- What do you usually do at weekends?
- How often do you chat with your friends?
- Do you use the internet? Why? Why not?

Food and Drink

- What is your favourite food? Why?
- Do you eat much fast food?
- Do you prefer eating out or at home?
- How often do you eat out with your family?

C: (Responds.)

I: (Interlocutor makes **brief** responses and/or comments.)

I: Thank you.

PART 2 (2 minutes)

I: Now, Part Two. I'm going to read some situations. I want you to start or respond as necessary. First situation (*choose one situation from* **A**).

- I'm your English teacher. I start.

 I think you should start studying a bit more.
- We're friends. I start.

 How about going to the cinema tonight?
- We're strangers in the street. I start. Sorry, could you tell me how to get to the museum?
- We're colleagues. I start.

- C: (Responds.)
- I: (Role-play the situation with the candidate approximately two turns each.)
- I: Second situation (*choose one situation from* **B**).


- We're strangers on the train. I am in your seat. You start.

- We're colleagues. You're thinking of quitting your job. You start.
- I'm your English teacher. You want to tell me that you haven't studied for today's test. You start.
- C: (Initiates.)
- I: (Role-play the situation with the candidate approximately two turns each.)
- I: (Role-play a third situation from **A** or **B** if time allows.)
- I: Thank you.

PART 3 (2 minutes)

I: Now, Part Three. In this part of the test we're going to discuss something together. All right?

A friend is returning from the UK. We want to throw a welcome party for him. Here are some ideas. (*Hand over candidate's task sheet.*) Let's ask and answer questions to help us decide. I'll start.

- I: First, think about it for thirty seconds and make some notes if you want. (Hand over piece of paper and pen/pencil.) So your topic is (repeat topic). All right? (Withdraw eye contact for thirty seconds. Leave tape/CD running.)
- I: (Candidate's name), please start.
- C: (Talks for about a minute.)
- I: (Choose follow-up questions.)

Follow-up questions

The importance of learning a foreign language.

- Why do you think people learn so many foreign languages?
- How can learning foreign languages help you?
- What is your favourite foreign language? Why?
- Would you ever live in a foreign country?

A day I will never forget.

- Why do you think people keep diaries?
- Is it a good idea to take pictures of places and people?
- Is it easy for you to remember things in general?
- Why do you think some people forget easily?

The weather in my country.

- Has the weather in your country changed the last few years?
- What do you think we should do to protect the environment?
- Which season is your favourite one?
- Where do you like to spend your summer holidays?
- I: Thank you. That is the end of the test. (*Give candidate's name*.) End of test.
